<b>Course Name</b>	HQ 841 Process Improvement in Healthcare
<b>Course Description</b>	This course offers the student a solid foundation in the current methods of process improvement in healthcare settings by incorporating best practices for process definition, value stream mapping and performance measurement in the course. Root cause analysis, hypothesis testing methods, and design of experiments (DOE) and other related analytical methods will be taught using relevant examples from different healthcare settings. Students will have the skills necessary to evaluate impact of their process improvement activities and be able to undertake ever increasingly complex improvement activities.

Topics include accident law, civil litigation, insurance and risk management; the course concentrates on the intersections of these areas to synthesize both a coherent system of redress and a risk and safety conscious system for organizing social behaviour.
