Program Overview	Queen's BNSc degree is a four-year, full-time program offered through two pathways: the Four-Year Track , which is for secondary school graduates and students with some university education and is 4 years in length, and the Accelerated Standing Track , which is for students who have completed at least 60.0 units of graded university credits and required prerequisite courses, allowing them to complete the program in 2 calendar years, including the Summer term, with a full normal course load. Both tracks provide evidence-based teaching and hands-on practical experience in clinical and community health settings, preparing students to become experienced, confident nursing graduates who, upon passing the professional certification exam, are designated as Registered Nurses ready to make a positive impact on health care.

Course Description	An introduction to the analysis of data from real life situations. The course covers sampling methods, descriptive and inferential statistics. Topics include probability, t-tests, regression, Chi-square tests, analysis of variance, and study design. Emphasis is placed on the foundation of statistical inference and the practical application of statistical methods using statistical software.
