**Course Professor (Term Adjuncts without benefits)**

<b>Program Overview</b>	Our <b>thesis-based</b> MNSc program consists of course work and a thesis. The thesis requires independent, original research and makes up at least two-thirds of the time normally required for the program. You will be taught primarily in small graduate seminars, providing a lively and critical environment to explore theory and clinical practice, while also giving you the opportunity to delve into your own research. With close mentoring relationships with faculty supervisors, you'll be nurtured throughout the program. Typically, students complete the program within two years.  Queen's Nursing also offers a <b>course-based</b> MNSc option, with a focus on advanced nursing practice. Students will take the same four core courses as thesis-based students in the first year and then complete a clinical project course during the summer and continuing into the fall of their second year. Students are also required to take three 800-level electives from a pre-approved list of courses in the School of Nursing, Health Quality Programs, the School of Rehabilitation Therapy, and the Department of Public Health Sciences.
<b>Course Name</b>	<b>NURS 897: Advanced Nursing Practice Project</b>
<b>Course Description</b>	Students in this course will develop skills to search for evidence for a clearly defined question related to advancing nursing practice, conduct a project and present findings in oral and written formats. There will be an introductory theory component followed by an independent project supervised by faculty. Summer and Fall.
