NURS 305 – Medical-Surgical Nursing II This course is about extending the knowledge acquired in Nursing 205. Students will explore additional clinical problems that challenge the well-being and functioning of adults with complex health challenges and unpredictable client outcomes. Evidence- informed care and a collaborative approach continue to be emphasized in discussing nursing interventions and responsibilities.

NURS 323 – Introduction to Statistics An introduction to the analysis of data from real life situations. The course covers sampling methods, descriptive and inferential statistics. Topics include probability, t-tests, regression, Chi-square tests, analysis of variance, and study design. Emphasis is placed on the foundation of statistical inference and the practical application of statistical methods using statistical software.

NURS 325 – Psychiatric Mental Health Nursing This course is about critical psychosocial and mental health issues that impact individuals, families, and groups in Canadian society. The nursing care of clients with mental illnesses, including mood and thought disorders, addictions, and significant mental health challenges across the lifespan are addressed. Advanced communication processes, nursing strategies, and therapeutic processes used in working with clients with complex psychosocial issues, such as suicide, family violence, aggression, end-of- life decisions and abuse, are explored
